



Iran's Leader Publishes New Book

Despite the nuclear deal signed between Iran and the P5+1 powers, the Islamic Republic continues to ridicule and threaten the world, specifically Israel. The Supreme Leader has now published a detailed book on how to annihilate the Jewish state.

Iran's Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, is again promoting Israel's destruction, this time with the publication of a book called Palestine, consisting of 416 pages that describe a plan to wipe out the Jewish state.

The New York Post was able to obtain a copy from Iran, the only place where the book is currently available, although an Arabic translation is expected soon.

Khamenei, described by a blurb about the book as "the flagbearer of Jihad to liberate Jerusalem," delivers one clear message in his work: Israel has no right to exist, and this is how it can be destroyed.

Kerry Visits ME but Skips Israel

US secretary of state State John Kerry to travel to Egypt and Qatar and meet with allies in attempt to alleviate concerns over nuclear agreement signed with Tehran. In what appears to be a new low in US-Israel relations he will not visit Israel, "the best ally of the United States"! "I think I've had more meetings with an Israeli prime minister and more visits than any secretary of state in history. And I consider Bibi a friend..." State John Kerry said.

(He is not just an enemy but a delusional liar - "With friends like these who needs an enemy!")








More from Kerry

Secretary of State Kerry made several eye-browraising remarks in defense of the Iran nuclear deal, claiming it is "as pro-Israel as it gets" and that Congress should be careful not to "screw" the Islamic leader.

'Don't Screw the Ayatollah'

Secretary of State Kerry said he "doesn't know" if Iran's leaders want to destroy Israel, and that the deal must be approved to avoid the "ultimate screwing" of the Ayatollah, who would be convinced that "you can't trust America."

A US State Department official issued an false, misleading statement, claiming that top Israeli security experts support the deal. They do not.





"You truly have a great prime minister in Benjamin Netanyahu. He's a winner, he's highly respected, he's highly thought of by all," Trump said in the 30-second spot. "Vote for Benjamin – terrific guy, terrific leader, great for Israel."

By the same token, Trump has made clear he believes President Barack Obama is bad for Israel and has questioned how American Jews could support the president.

"I have many Jewish friends that support Obama and I say, 'Why?' and they can't explain why. They support him, they give him money, they give him campaign contributions," Trump told radio host Michael Savage in February. "This is the worst enemy of Israel."
