US President Donald Trump's plans for Syria have come into clearer view since he ordered cruise missiles fired on a Syrian air base to punish Assad for a chemical weapons attack. The strategy breaks down into three basic phases: defeating the ISIS group, restoring stability in Syria region-by-region and securing a political transition in which Assad ultimately steps down.


"Abbas ready for visit to Washington": The London-based al-Hayat said April 14 that the delegation preparing for Abbas' visit will include senior Palestinian negotiator Saeb Erekat and intelligence chief Majed Faraj. The lack of a firm date has led some Palestinian media to report that the visit has been postponed, but a US White House source quickly shot down this rumor, insisting that the visit is still on." [Al-Monitor] "Al-Quds said Trump's team has prepared a draft plan demanding that the Palestinians return to negotiations with Israel without setting any conditions and halt transfer of funds to the besieged Gaza Strip." "Every year [at Iran's military parade] the missiles are bigger and enhanced—in accuracy, strength, and deadliness," Netanyahu said at a cabinet meeting at the time. "However, one thing does not change. What does not change is the inscription 'Death to Israel' on the missiles."

Israel Treating Wounded from Syria. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said that Israel remained committed to treating war wounded from Syria. Israel has treated more than 3,000 war wounded from Syria in what it describes as a humanitarian gesture.



# ISRAELI VIEW ON TWO STATES



While the international community clings to visions of a two-state solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, Israeli public opinion is unified in asserting that the establishment of a Palestinian state is unrealistic and undesirable.

Only 12 percent of Jewish Israelis believe that withdrawing from the West Bank would end the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, <u>according to a survey published by the Jerusalem Center for Public Affairs</u> at the end of March.

Overall, Jewish support for withdrawal from the West Bank has decreased from 60 percent in 2005 to 36 percent in 2017. The survey also found that 79 percent of Jewish Israelis believe that it is important to retain a unified Jerusalem under Israeli sovereignty. Such a stance is at odds with the international community's oft-mentioned two-state plan of dividing Jerusalem and making it the capital of both Israel and a proposed Palestinian state.

"The Palestinian insistence on having their capital in Jerusalem is the true obstacle to peace," Professor Efraim Inbar of Bar-Ilan University's Begin-Sadat Center for Strategic Studies told *JNS.org*.



### PA TEXTBOOKS

The Palestinian Authority (PA) announced Thursday it is suspending ties with the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) over changes that make the <u>agency's school curriculum</u> more sympathetic to Israel and more historically accurate and truthful.

The PA's Education Ministry called the changes an "affront to the Palestinian people, its history and struggles," and vowed the suspension will not change until UNRWA reverses the changes.

UNRWA schools serve more than 312,000 Palestinian children, including 262,000 students in Gaza as well as 50,000 in the Judea and Samaria and Jerusalem.

Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) has folded under Palestinian pressure and will not make changes to the agency's school curriculum. The curriculum will not be more sympathetic to Israel and more historically accurate and truthful. Instead, it will continue to teach the Palestinian Authority (PA) curriculum, which is fraught with incitement against Israel and teaches that the Jewish State lacks the right to exist.







### ISIS vs CHRISTIANS



ISIS attacked a monastery in the heart of the Sinai Peninsula on Tuesday, continuing its wake of terror targeting Christians in Egypt. ISIS forces opened fire from a hilltop overlooking the police checkpoint situated about 800 yards from Saint Catherine's Monastery, a popular tourist site in the heart of the Sinai Peninsula. One Egyptian police officer was killed and four others were injured. It is believed that some of the ISIS attackers were wounded before fleeing the scene. The Islamic State (ISIS) claimed responsibility for the attack via the ISIS-affiliated *Amaq* news agency.


## HOLOCAUST

Recently released documents show that the Allied forces were aware of the scale of the Holocaust some two years earlier than previously assumed. They did little to stop the deaths or rescue the victims.

The unsealed United Nations files show that the US, UK and Russia knew as early as December 1942 that two million Jews had been massacred and millions more were at risk of being killed, Britain's Independent newspaper reported on Tuesday. Despite that knowledge, the Allies did not accept refugees or take action to prevent the slaughter.


