THIS WEEK'S HEADLINES

- * Russia's military says it may have killed leader of Islamic State. Russian Defense Ministry says it is trying to confirm information suggesting **Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi** was killed in a May airstrike near Raqqa.
- * Senior White House adviser **Jared Kushner** is to travel to the Middle East this week to meet with Israeli and Palestinian officials in an effort to advance peace efforts pursued by his father-in-law US President Donald Trump. Kushner will meet with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas separately in the coming days, to discuss "their priorities and potential next steps."
- * Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has instructed the defense establishment to examine the possibility of turning the area around **Damascus Gate** in Jerusalem into a sterile zone, at least in part, with the result that anyone passing through would face more rigorous security screening.
- * The Hamas leadership in Gaza has threatened Israel with "an explosion" if it does not supply electricity to Gaza at the expense of Israeli taxpayers. Blackmail is, of course, part of the Hamas repertoire. HADAS MALKA, 23

The Border Police officer killed in a coordinated stabbing and shooting attack in two areas in Jerusalem's Old City on Friday evening was identified late Friday as Hadas Malka, 23. The three attackers, who were allegedly members of Palestinian terrorist groups, were shot dead in the course of the attacks.

Malka was critically injured in a stabbing attack on Sultan Suleiman Street near Damascus Gate on Friday evening. She was transferred to Hadassah Hospital Mount Scopus in Jerusalem where she underwent emergency surgery but later succumbed to her injuries.

She fought her attacker for several seconds while attempting to draw her weapon, according to a Border Police statement. Nearby troops shot and killed the assailant.

ISIS or FATAH?

JTA – When the Islamic State claimed credit for an attack on Israeli soil for the first time Friday and vowed to strike again, the response in Israel was not fear but disbelief.

Israeli officials generally dismissed the Islamist terror group's assertion that it was behind the shooting and stabbing in Jerusalem that left a 23-year-old policewoman, Hadas Malka, dead along with her attackers.

Top US experts on the group said the officials would be wise to think again. US analysts warned that the Islamic State rarely bluffs about attacks. The group has long vowed to destroy the Jewish state, they said, and it may finally be trying to follow through.

HADAS MALKA'S KILLERS

Israel Police on Wednesday arrested two people in connection with last Friday's Palestinian terror attack in which Border Policewoman Staff Sgt. Hadas Malka was murdered at the Damascus Gate entrance to Jerusalem's Old City.


One suspect is the mother of one of the terrorists.

Police said the woman, a resident of the Palestinian village of Deir Abu Mash'al near Ramallah, where the terror cell was situated, was arrested on suspicion of forging contacts with the intent of committing a crime.

She is also suspected of incitement related to recent statements lauding *shahids* [martyrs] and calling for the harming of Jews.

"We will meet in heaven. I'm proud. I wanted him to kill 20, 50, 100 of them," the Palestinian mother stated after the attack.

Also on Wednesday, police arrested a resident of Issawiya, an Arab neighborhood of Jerusalem, on suspicion that he drove the terrorists to the site of the attack. He is suspected of knowing the terrorists' intentions to carry out the attack but failing to report them.


PM warns Iran after missile strike: Do not threaten us! PM Benjamin Netanyahu says Israel watches Iran's every move.

Despite failed missile strike on Islamic State targets, Iranian official is upbeat: "Israel is [Iran's] chief enemy and should tread carefully. I think it got the message the missiles sent."

A day after Iran's rare missile strike against Islamic State forces in Syria, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu warned Tehran not to test Israel's resolve.

"Our security forces constantly monitor Iran's activities in the area and its efforts to give sophisticated weapon systems to Hezbollah; we monitor their actions and their words, and I have one thing to say to Iran: Don't threaten Israel," Netanyahu said.

The PA is demanding that UNESCO register the Cave of the Patriarchs, Judaism's second-holiest spot, as a Palestinian World Heritage site,

The Palestinian Authority (PA) is requesting that the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization's (UNESCO) World Heritage Committee, whose annual meeting is scheduled for July 1 in Krakow, Poland, register the Old City of Hebron–including the Cave of the Patriarchs–as a Palestinian World Heritage Site, Israel's Yediot Ahronot reported.






KEEP YOUR EYES ON TURKEY

Turkey aims to tighten Muslim grip on Temple Mount. Ankara is reportedly pouring millions of dollars into east Jerusalem, the Old City and the Temple Mount in a concerted effort to position itself as a Muslim power in the city.

As Turkey attempts to restore Ottoman glory, Jordan's influence is waning. A century after the fall of the Ottoman Empire, Turkish foundations and organizations are making a concerted effort to enhance the country's prominence as a Muslim player in Jerusalem by funneling millions of dollars to the eastern section of the city and the Temple Mount area, Israel Hayom has learned.

Among its endeavors, TIKA has invested in restoring the Ottoman Muslim archives on the Temple Mount; placing a large water tanker for worshippers at the site; restoring Shashelet Street in the Old City's Muslim Quarter; renovating the Muslim cemetery at the foot of the Temple Mount's eastern wall; and in a considerable number of religious and community projects throughout east Jerusalem.



HEZBOLLAH THREATS

Nasrallah says Hezbollah is preparing 'a big surprise' for Israel. In speech to supporters, Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah reveals Syria has armed his organization and other terrorist groups in Gaza with long-range missiles. Hezbollah is preparing a "big surprise" for Israel, the Shiite organization's secretary-general, Hassan Nasrallah, said on Wednesday in a speech marking the sixth anniversary of the Second Lebanon War.

During the speech, delivered via video feed to a crowd of Hezbollah supporters in Beirut, Nasrallah proudly revealed that Syria had been arming Hezbollah, as well as groups in the Gaza Strip, with long-range missiles capable of reaching all of central Israel, including Tel Aviv.






CAUTION!

"Trump Administration Pressuring Israel to Move Ahead With Peace Deal, Senior Israeli Minister Moshe Kahlon Says" by Barak Ravid: "There's mounting American pressure to advance a deal," Moshe Kahlon told a conference in central Israel on Tuesday. "Something has happened. The American government feels it can reach an agreement, maybe because the good ties with the Israeli government allow Trump more influence than was possible during Obama's term." [Haaretz]

NFL HALL OF FAMERS

Some of football's biggest Hall of Famers are in Israel this week for an historic visit with Jewish New England Patriots owner Robert Kraft aimed at promoting football in the Holy Land and exposing the players to the truth about the Jewish state.

Six-time pro-bowler Jerome Bettis went even further, praising the "love affair that Israelis have with their country." He said that he and his wife stayed up late discussing their experience in Jerusalem, and that the visit had "changed our lives."

"Here, it feels like family," Staubach said, going on to praise what he described as the country's "resilience" on the battlefield.

"The people here are wonderful," said four-time Super Bowl champion Joe Montana. Cornerback Lem Barney told media that he had been drawn to Israel for religious reasons. Barney, who serves as associate minister at Empowerment Church in Southfield, Michigan, described the "great spirituality" in the country. "This is a dream come true," he said.

"Israel is the center of what's happening, and it's good to see it," added tight end Dave Casper.




