- * The UN Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) confirmed on Thursday that a tunnel discovered by Israel earlier this year alongside the Lebanese-Israeli border, dug by the terrorist group Hezbollah, was the third violation of a ceasefire measure.

The undeniable rise of antisemitism in the U.S. was highlighted in red on Saturday when a young man walked into a synagogue in San Diego and opened fire, killing a 60-year-old woman and wounding three others. The act of terrorism takes on an end-of-days significance since it came on the last day of Passover, referred to in Chabad Judaism as "Moshiach's Festival," the culmination of the redemption commemorated by Passover. "America has many fine traits and much merit but even there, Jews are in danger," Rabbi Berger said, noting that one of the men injured in the attack moved to California from Sderot, the beleaguered city in southern Israel that exists under constant threat of Hamas missile attacks.

Lori Gilbert Kaye was killed jumping in front of the gun to save Rabbi Goldstein's life. Rabbi Goldstein grabbed the gun, which then jammed, helping save other peoples lives. Oscar Stewart, a military veteran, charged the gunman as he was trying to escape, stopping other people from being shot. And finally, Jonathan Morales, an offduty US Border Patrol agent, who was praying at the Synagogue, called Stewart to step aside as he then shot at the terrorist to stop him. All heroes.






"He was amazing," said Rabbi Goldstein, "I have never spoken with a president of the United States before." Speaking to the radio station, Rabbi Goldstein said he asked Trump: "What are you doing about the anti-Semitism?" Trump answered: "You know, I have a son-in-law that is Jewish, my daughter is Jewish, my grandkids are Jewish. I love Israel and I support Israel. I just annexed the Golan Heights and I moved the embassy. My love is for the Jewish people."

"I never heard such words from any president before," Rabbi Goldstein said. "He was so kind and so generous with his words."





TALK OF THE TOWN – The alleged synagogue shooter was a churchgoer who talked Christian theology, raising tough questions for evangelical pastors - by Julie Zauzmer: "Before he allegedly walked into a synagogue in Poway, Calif., and opened fire, John Earnest appears to have written a seven-page letter spelling out his core beliefs: that Jewish people, guilty in his view of faults ranging from killing Jesus to controlling the media, deserved to die. That his intention to kill Jews would glorify God. Days later, the Rev. Mika Edmondson read those words and was stunned. 'It certainly calls for a good amount of soul-searching,' said Edmondson, a pastor in the Orthodox Presbyterian Church... Earnest's actions on Saturday in Poway have spurred debate among evangelical pastors about the role of a certain stream of Christian theology in shaping the young man's worldview."






What if the New York Times Cartoon had depicted a Muslim, a Lesbian, an African American or a Mexican as a Dog?



Mati Kochavi, an Israeli tech tycoon, thinks the popular app offers a way to make the Holocaust relatable to a younger, tech-savvy generation – and he's made a major new social media project called @eva.stories, timed to coincide with this year's Holocaust Memorial Day to bring the Holocaust to life. The series has been promoted for months in Israel. Posters show a hand holding a cellphone behind barbed wire and ask: "What if a girl in the Holocaust had Instagram?"

The series of fictionalized short films follow the real-life diary of Eva Heyman, a Jewish girl who lived in the Hungarian town of Nagyvarad who kept a diary documenting her experiences starting on her 13th birthday – just like the fictional Instagram account based on her writings.
