Bahrain is establishing full diplomatic relations with Israel, US President Donald Trump announced Friday, making it the second Gulf country to do so in less than a month.

A joint statement released by the White House said Bahrain's King Hamad bin Salman al-Khalifa spoke earlier in the day with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu "and agreed to the establishment of full diplomatic relations between Israel and the Kingdom of Bahrain."

"Another HISTORIC breakthrough today! Our two GREAT friends Israel and the Kingdom of Bahrain agree to a Peace Deal - the second Arab country to make peace with Israel in 30 days!" Trump tweeted.









Oman welcomes Bahrain's decision to normalize relations with Israel and hopes it will contribute to Israeli-Palestinian peace, Oman state media said on Sunday. "[Oman] hopes this new strategic path taken by some Arab countries will contribute to bringing about a peace based on an end to the Israeli occupation of Palestinian lands and on establishing an independent Palestinian state with East Jerusalem as capital," the government statement said.

Israel's intelligence minister said a few days after the UAE-Israel accord was announced on Aug. 13 that Oman could also formalize ties with the country.

While the EU issued a statement supporting the peace agreements between Israel and its Arab neighbors, the EU statement focused on "a negotiated and viable two-state solution built upon the internationally agreed parameters," a clear reference to Palestinian demands.

The reason for the lack of EU diplomats at the signing on Tuesday remains unclear, however, many member states have remained hostile to the Trump administration and for the most part support the Palestinians in their conflict with Israel.

The Palestinians for their part have condemned in no uncertain terms the peace agreements between Israel and its Arab neighbors.





Palestinian Authority Prime Minister
Mohammad Shtayyeh has called on Arab states
to boycott Tuesday's signing ceremony, which
he described as "a black day... that will be
added to the Palestinian calendar of pain."

Shtayyeh's call came as the PA's ruling Fatah party and the Hamas terrorist group urged Palestinians to stage protests against the deals.

More than a dozen rockets were fired from Gaza into Israel over the past day, beginning during the White House ceremony yesterday. Six Israelis were wounded – including a father of 15 handing out food to the needy. The IDF struck sites in Gaza in response.
